Authorized Lay Preacher/Commissioned Pastor Preparation Program

A newly revised Authorized Lay Preacher/Commissioned Pastor (ALP/CP) Preparation Program will begin with Presby Prep in January 2022. Some of the changes include that Presby Prep courses will meet on Zoom rather than in person, for approximately 3 hours once a month on Saturdays (and potentially on a different day for those not available on Saturdays); computer literacy is required. These courses are also suitable for those who would just like to know more about our Presbyterian beliefs, history, worship, polity, and more. Our Circles will start meeting next month and we'd love to have you join us!



Children's Home Society of West Virginia

The Hovah Hall Underwood Shelter is located in a beautiful rural setting in Ona. It is an emergency shelter for children who are "in the system", but do not have a foster family home. Ann Schurman, Anne Myers and Nancy Estler toured the facility in July. We were welcomed by our contact and friend Belinda, Regional Resource Director. Olivia, the director of the shelter was happy to show us around and answer all our questions.

We were impressed with everything we saw there. The Children's Home Society is a non profit private organization. They have both state and national accreditation. They rely on Medicaid funding for needed therapies and DHHR provides a small amount for room and board. CHS must rely on fundraising, grants, and donations to cover other expenses. We saw a caring staff, engaged with children. Living quarters were neat and their storage of clothing and toiletries was well organized. Children often arrive with just the clothes on their backs or with belongings in a garbage bag. The Shelter keeps clothing on hand and always provides suitable luggage or duffle bags when they leave.

The Shelter is fortunate to have an air conditioned indoor gym. It could always use a new or better equipment like a new volleyball net and balls, basketballs, ping pong tables, etc. We were very impressed with the "Level 3 Room". It is a cheerful space with comfy chairs, books, games, TV and popcorn maker. It is used as a reward for positive behavior.

We learned that there are gaps in the system. Children in the system move around a lot making it difficult to make friends and have a feeling of stability. Children age out of the system on their 18th birthday whether they have a support system, home or have completed high school. Because of their non-traditional lives, most do not know how to drive, apply for a job, manage money or a bank account, cook or sew on a button.

We are exploring ways we as a church can meet the various needs of these children. We will continue to solicit donations of money and supplies but we are also looking into ways to share our skills, our time and our love with these children.

Any gifts received will be included into the summary that each of you receive at year-end regarding your HPC gifts.






